As Chairperson of the PPC I am acutely aware that our Council is responsible as an advisor and support to the Priest in Charge and that is what we do, hopefully in a spirit of love and truth. Sometimes the decisions we make are not popular as the full truth is not known by our critics, but I can assure you that we are called to hold these positions and we govern to the best of our ability with the power of Christ working through us.

To give you an overview of what has been happening in the parish this past year, one great blessing has been to have Father John –Allen appointed to serve for the next three years, thank you to our Bishop Graham who interceded for us in trying to stabilise the parish and grow the many facets of parish life which Father started with us in his first term. Mass attendance continues to grow. Fortunately at the recent chapter a new priest was appointed to oversee the convents so Father has been relieved of these duties and is now able to spend more time with us. All the groups and classes continue this year with RCIA, marriage prep classes, baptism preparation, the Contemplative prayer group, Catechism, Youth has begun once more. Father has also been very busy with retraining the Extraordinary Ministers, the Catechism teachers, Proclaimers, Sacristans and Knights of Da Gama. I think this has been very successful and we have all benefitted from a memory jog! Thank you for your time and dedication in this Father.

The SVDP continues to provide food; clothing and financial support for those who are unable to support themselves, they now run the feeding scheme in town that was formerly run from the hall. The Social Fundraising committee continue to do outstanding work and +- R100 000 was raised in the last year! Exceptional effort and dedication thank you to Freddy and his team of dedicated members.

The Choir and Liturgy portfolio continue to be efficiently run thank you Michelle (Liturgy) Evelyn (Choir). Candida (flowers), Francesca (hospitality) and Father (Altar servers). Thank you to Inky who continues to be more than a Secretary by fulfilling many other tasks in and around the Parish. Anton has also been a valuable addition of expertise in almost any field! If in doubt ask Anton, he is ever so willing, thank you! Moses and all the staff in the Friary and Presbytery continue to work well and Moses is never seen without a smile on his wonderful friendly face.

Catechism is still going well with Penny assisting with the Sunday Co-ordination which has made a tremendous difference to the way it is being organised, thank you Penny you have taken a load of my shoulders! Last year we had? Confirmation candidates Confirmed and ? Children went through for 1st Communion.

The CWL has recently been suspended as members were not adhering to their Constitution by allowing people to stay members when they are in disunion with the church and with our Pastor. Hopefully this will be rectified soon as it has affected the repository which was also run by CWL.

The changes in the Parish which I am sure you have noticed have been made possible through specific donations. The infant chapel has been completed as well as the Peace garden, the roof of the church was repaired and no longer leaks, the easy access to the rest rooms has been completed and the extension of the Sacristy is ongoing at the moment and hopefully will be completed before Easter?? Thank you so much to the generous donors of all these projects. I am sure you will agree that they enhance many aspects of Parish life. There are also donations for projects pledged for the coming year.

We are about to launch the new Parish website, it should be up and running in the coming week. This promises to be a much more streamlined viewing experience and easy to update. The domain name will remain the same. Father will be able to run a blog with the new website and it will have a number of new features.

A very big thank you to everyone who unselfishly gives of their time, commitment, effort and talents to grow the Kingdom of God here in Ladysmith. You are abundantly blessed by His Grace and may He continue to bless us always. Thank you Lord.

There are thirteen active Extra Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion serving the Parish.

A successful refresher course was given recently by Fr. John Allen. All members were made more aware of the reverence required in the Sanctuary area and the significance of administering the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and Precious Blood. Everybody benefitted. What was further emphasised was how the ministers should be seen in their daily lives by other parishioners and correct terminology should be used when referring to the sacred vessels and the Eucharist and Precious Blood.

SACRISTANS:

There are eight active Sacristans serving the Parish currently.

A refresher and beginners course was also recently held by Father. More members are required in this important ministry. This ministry if performed timeously, reverently and diligently enables Father to prepare himself mentally and spiritually to celebrate Mass. The Sacristans duty alleviates the concern with setting up, vestments, sacred vessels and readings.

CHOIR:

There are approximately eleven dedicated members meeting on a weekly basis practising the hymns for Mass.

FLOWERS:

Approximately six ladies committed to this ministry of beautifying our church.

LECTORS:


This ministry comprises eleven readers.

Parish Priests Report to the AGM 27th March, 2015.

We have now commenced a second three year cycle of my appointment as Pastor of the Ladysmith Parish which will terminate in January 2018. The current year under review has had many challenges but also with promises of good things to come.

Although I have retained my appointments on the Boards of the Duduza Care Centre and St Antonine's Old Age Home, I have now ended my extended duties as Spiritual Father to the many convents and have more time to concentrate on my core responsibilities as a pastor.

A programme of training and revitalizing all the lay ministries and various groups and sodalities has been undertaken and all lay ministers who have tackled this programme of renewal will be commissioned on Sunday, 12th April.

Policies and procedures have been documented and collated to provide our future leaders with a memory of what has passed. This document is now ready for presentation to our Bishop Graham. I thank especially Inky for his calm perseverance in this onerous task.

The feeding scheme from the parish hall which I initiated in 2011 has been discontinued and all food parcels and distribution of Soya is now undertaken through the ministry of the St Vincent de Paul Society directly at their point of need. Thank you, to Mr Brian Kennedy for your generous donations to this feeding programme. Thank you Gerti for you dedication to this programme.

I am now resident at **the Presbytery and Catechetical Centre**. Although it was indeed painful in 2012 to have to write off R120, 000 in arrear rentals plus make a further R10, 000 relocation payment, the centre is now utilized to its proper potential in the pursuit of formation and evangelization.

Private donations has enabled the parish to install an operation **cry room**, to repair the **leaking church roof**, replace the **damaged sound equipment**, to provide **easy access to the toilet facilities**, to **extend the sacristy** and to establish our beautiful **Peace Garden** dedicated to the memory of my late brother Shaun. Plans are also being made through a private donor to install **additional wooden benches**. As Franciscans we pray every day for our benefactors, living and deceased.

Since May 2014 I have endeavoured both in writing and through personal contact to persuade the **CWL** to revert to Catholic doctrine and the precepts of the Church i.r.o. their membership to this body. This was not implemented and this disobedience has subsequently been aggravated by the violation of Sacramental and Canon Law which then resulted in the public and immoral breach of **the 9th Commandment: You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour**. This breach is fully documented. **The Apostles have taught that any such** public dishonour is a sin against justice, and entails the obligation of making suitable restitution. When guilty of offering a public insult to another, we must offer an equally public satisfaction. **I have therefore revoked the privileges of the CWL, Ladysmith Branch**. It is our prayerful hope that the organization will soon reform and return to the norms required so that the good works of this national movement may be continued within our parish.

It is my hope that we will soon have a parish repository established and running for the benefit of our parish.

The third millennium offers us as Catholics many challenges but also many opportunities. As we see our demographics here in Ladysmith change, there may be an experience of fear; let us remember the promise of Christ to his church; do not fear, I am with you always, even to the end of time.

We may have become comfortable with old ways, old memories and old clothes, but Christ is always a new way and any encounter with the living and true God must forever change us and send us back along a different route.

My most sincere thanks to all the members of the PPC and FPC as well as the Social Committee and my brothers in the Knights of da Gama and to all those who made the last three years journey with me. Let us remember that it is always Christ who does the building even while our sight is blurred.
